SCHOOL COVID-19 REGULATIONS



It's been great to have all the children in the school again.

Thank you to those parents who have been sticking to the regulations, however there been a few incidences where the drop off and pick up regulations have not been stuck to which is very important in order to control the amount of people on the school site at one given time. Here is a reminder of the regulations in place in order to keep everyone safe.

Entrance to the school site is via the gate on Araglen Avenue and then exit is via the gate leading onto Annalee Gardens.

A face covering **MUST** be worn by anyone over 11 years of age at all times when on the school site and only one person per family can collect you child/children.

Please do not wait in the playground, as soon as you have collected your child/children please then make your way towards the exit.

Unfortunately, you will not be able to speak to your child/children's class teacher at the door during drop off and pick up. This is again to reduce the amount of people on the school site at once and to avoid congestion. If you need to speak to your child/children's class teacher then either ring the office to arrange a meeting or email the teacher. Emails will only be answered during school hours



The children start and finish times are as follows:
 Surname's with A-C – Arrive: 8:50am Collection: 3pm
 Surname's with D-I – Arrive: 8:55am Collection: 3:05pm
 Surname's with J-P – Arrive: 9am Collection: 3:10pm
 Surname's with Q-Z – Arrive: 9:05am Collection: 3:15pm



Please stick to these times so that the congestion on the playground is kept to a minimum. Children with permission to walk home alone will be released on their collection time.

By everyone sticking to these regulations we have put in place, as a school we can in turn keep everyone safe.

Who can take part?

Students aged 5-19 studying in the UK or attending a British school overseas can enter artworks.

How can I enter?

Submitting artwork is completely free and is done online. Take your artwork into school or send your teacher a picture and they will submit it for you. They will need to know what your inspiration was to create your art and how you made it. **Please submit all art work to your teacher by 21 April!**

What kind of artworks do you accept?

The artwork can be made using any medium (a word for the materials you've used to create your piece). It can be a painting, sculpture, photograph, installation, video, drawing, or a combination. There is no theme so artworks can be of any subject and we don't mind when you made the artwork as long as you are between 5-19 when you submit it. We also welcome collaborative pieces made by more than one student, a whole class, or even a whole year group!

How does the judging work?

All of the artworks are viewed and judged by a panel of artists and art professionals. There are two sets of judges, one for artworks made by primary students and one for secondary. When the judges make their selections, they choose which artworks will be shown online and which will be shown at the Royal Academy. Everyone who submits artworks will hear from us by the end of May.

Prizes

Prizes are awarded each year for two inspiring artworks from each key stage, as chosen by the President of the Royal Academy, and you can also vote for your favourite artwork in our annual People's Choice Award. All prize winners will receive vouchers for art materials plus a free practical workshop for their school.

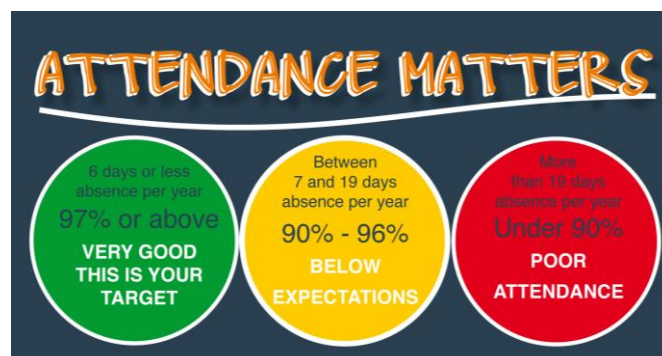
